Incorrect or general coding could lead to nonpayment or reduced payment for healthcare providers and result in unnecessary out-of-pocket expenses for patients. Taking the initiative to improve clinical documentation now can help make the transition to ICD-10-CM easier for healthcare providers, coding staff and patients.

Dr. Scott Kaatz, Hurley Chief Quality Officer and Clinical Associate Professor of Medicine, MSU College of Human Medicine, was recently a contributing author to a New England Journal of Medicine Article on blood thinners. Here is a synapsis written by Dr. Kaatz:

Atrial fibrillation (a.fib) is the most common type of irregular heart beat and approximately 1 in 4 Americans over the age of 40 will develop this during their lifetime. Patients with atrial fibrillation are at risk of having a stroke and most are treated with a blood thinner to prevent this complication. When surgery or another invasive medical procedure, eg. colonoscopy, is required, blood thinners must be interrupted.

Warfarin (Coumadin) is the most common type of blood thinner and interruption of this medication takes about 5 days for the full effect to wear off before surgery can be performed. In addition, warfarin takes another 5 days or so to reach full effect after surgery or an invasive procedure. Patients are felt to be at risk of stroke during the time that warfarin is wearing off and being restarted and this gap in blood thinning or anticoagulation is typically "bridged" with a shorter acting blood thinner that is injected under the skin. However, it is not known if the use of shorter acting blood thinners; low molecular weight heparin (LMWH) protect against stroke and if they cause excessive bleeding and hence more harm than good.

A trial of over 1800 patients from the United States and Canada was recently presented at an international meeting and published in the New England Journal of Medicine. The BRIDGE trail showed there was no benefit from stroke prevention between patients that used LMWH or a placebo injection under the skin. Patients that were assigned to the usual treatment with LMWH also had significantly more bleeding.

This study was funded by the National Institute of Health and the National Heart, Lung and Blood Institute and clearly demonstrated that the usual clinical practice that was based on sound reasoning does not help and in fact harms patients. Patients with atrial fibrillation who are taking the blood thinner warfarin (Coumadin) can safely have their medication stopped and do not need to "bridge" the gap in therapy with LMWH. Wide spread adoption of the results of this trial could save thousands of patients from bleeding unnecessarily each year.

Dictation Update

Please assist us in maximizing reimbursement by ensuring our facility's clinical documentation is fast, accurate, and thorough. Only after care has been documented can it be billed, so the turnaround time (TAT) of clinical documentation reduces the days to bill. The integrity of clinical documentation is essential when assessing and defending reimbursement rates-so accuracy minimizes the potential for disrupted billing. And thoroughness ensures all billable items are included in the patient's record.

Currently, the top two areas that cause delays in billing are:

- Providing the Assistant's full name (if applicable); and,
- 2. Inclusion of the date of procedure/service.

As a reminder, the following items must be included with your dictations:

- Appropriate Identification Codes:
 - o Physician ID
 - o Patient CSN Number
 - o Work Type
- Appropriate Identification Information
 - o Physician's Name
 - o Attending Physician's Name (if applicable)
 - Assistant's First and Last Name (if applicable)
 - o Patient's Name (spelling) and another identifier (i.e., CSN#, medical record #)
 - o Type of Report
 - o Important Dates (admission, date of procedure, discharge)
